A BILL

To amend title 49, United States Code, with respect to commercial driver's license requirements, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the "Protecting America's
5 Roads Act".

6 **SEC. 2. COMMERCIAL DRIVER'S LICENSE REQUIREMENTS.**

7 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 31308 of title 49, United
8 States Code, is amended—

1 (1) in paragraph (1)—

2 (A) in subparagraph (A) by striking “and”
3 at the end; and

4 (B) by adding at the end the following:

5 “(C) present valid documentation proving
6 citizenship status, lawful permanent resident
7 status, or a valid work authorization; and

8 “(D) present valid documentation of domi-
9 cile in the State in which the commercial driv-
10 er’s license is issued;”; and

11 (2) in paragraph (3) by striking “and” at the
12 end;

13 (3) in paragraph (4)(E) by striking the period
14 and inserting a semicolon; and

15 (4) by adding at the end the following:

16 “(5) prohibit a State from issuing a commercial
17 driver’s license to an individual who is not domiciled
18 in such State;

19 “(6) require States to use the SAVE system for
20 any non-citizen applicant for a commercial driver’s
21 license, maintain documents related to such appli-
22 cant for not less than 2 years, and deny any appli-
23 cant if the SAVE system does not confirm lawful
24 presence of such applicant;

1 necessary to terminate any existing reciprocity agreements
2 that recognize foreign commercial driver's licenses in the
3 United States or permit holders of foreign commercial
4 driver's licenses to operate a commercial motor vehicle in
5 the United States, unless expressly authorized by statute.

6 **SEC. 4. AGENCY COOPERATION.**

7 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, any
8 agency operating under section 287(g) of the Immigration
9 and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C. 1357(g)) may use the au-
10 thority of such Agency to identify and address foreign na-
11 tionals unlawfully operating commercial motor vehicles in
12 the United States and report to the Administrator of the
13 Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration.

14 **SEC. 5. EFFECTIVE DATE.**

15 This Act shall take effect on the date that is 6
16 months after the date of enactment of this Act.
